Wonderful News for the Valley!

With the help of great volunteers, Aquatic Invasive Species samples were collected throughout the 2020 field season on 11 lakes in and around the Clearwater Watershed: Lindbergh, Holland, Placid, Seeley, Salmon, Big Sky, Inez, Alva, Browns, Upsata, and Coopers. Monitoring included five rounds of sampling at each lake, followed with analysis by the Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks lab in Helena. We are extremely happy to report another mussel-free sampling year in the Clearwater: zebra and quagga mussel veligers were undetected in all of the samples collected and analyzed in 2020. Great work boaters! Keep those boats clean to protect and preserve our pristine lakes.
